Are you 65 years of age or will you be 65 years of age by December 31, 2009?

Did you live in your home as of January 1, 2008 or January 1, 2009?

Is your name on the deed or do you have rights as the beneficiary of the trust?

If you have answered yes to all of these questions, you may be entitled to a property tax exemption for Senior Citizens.

This is not a deferral. The exemption is not paid back at any time in the future.

Do you have a total household income of less than \$55,000?

Are you receiving Social Security Disability benefits?
(Class 2 or 2A disability per state qualification)

Are you a disabled veteran (at least 50% service connected disability per V.A. qualification) who is receiving disability benefits?

If you have answered yes to any of these questions, you may be entitled to a property tax exemption for Senior Citizens, Disabled Persons, or Disabled Veterans.

These are not deferrals. The exemption is not paid back at any time in the future.
